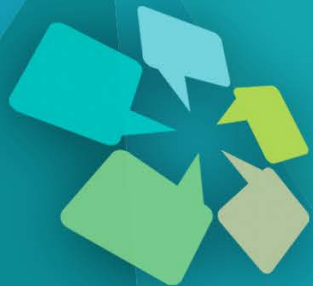
- Review and update Municipal Development Plan

Key Actions and Milestones

- Develop Transit strategy options for decision in 2018
- Improve traffic flows throughout Cochrane



Design and construct Bow River Bridge and connecting road network

- Design Centre Avenue intersection and approaches to railway to accommodate four lanes
- Advocate for Hwy 1A improvements between Gleneagles Drive and new interchange at Hwy 22 and 1A, including intersections at Centre Avenue and Fifth Avenue
- Continue to work with Alberta Transportation on design and construction of the 1A/22 interchange
- Improve local and regional pathway network



Focus on community services such as emergency services, water supply and community spaces that achieve an improved sense of community.

Key Actions and Milestones

- Advocate for improved EMS coverage and 24-hour care at Cochrane Community Health Centre



- Design and build a new integrated police detachment
- Study designs for:
 - Fifth Avenue site (including Lions Rodeo Grounds and considering a variety of users: seniors, youth, etc)
 - 1-acre site east of the library
 - Former Esso bulk station site
- Focus on achieving organizational efficiencies and an effective asset management system (e.g. infrastructure assessment and funding strategy)
